

- Hobbies: Walking, traveling, food festivals








Colleen Vaughan

What is KP3? Kindergarten Purposeful Placement Process

A process by which all students have the opportunity to experience both classroom settings and peers across the grade level in order to create a well-balanced class grouping.





What does KP3 look like?

• Each student is assigned an animal name

- Students rotate once per day for a week
- Students have a base class where they begin and end each day





Benefits of KP3

- In depth look at students' individual strengths and needs
- Create a well balanced and diverse student grouping
- Teachers build relationships with all students






